Class News

- In ELA, we are continuing to read and write about what makes a pet special. We will also be creating and writing about our own monster pets. In addition, we will start reading and writing words with short vowels.
- In Math, we are continuing to engage in exploring part-part-whole relationships within 20. This includes finding the total or sum of two groups, or finding an unknown part of a whole group. We are also estimating and measuring objects with nonstandard units such as popsicle sticks and unifix cubes.
