- In ELA, we are continuing to write a personal narrative using the writing process. This week we will be writing the rough draft and start to edit our writing. In addition to reading and writing words with short vowels and digraphs ( $\mathrm{wh}, \mathrm{ch}, \mathrm{sh}$, th, and ck ), we will start to read and write words with "bonus letters": ff,II, ss, and zz, and the "glued sound" -all later this week.
- This week in Math the focus is on counting by $5 s$ and 10 s to become more efficient at counting amounts larger than 10.

This is also a great time of year to start practicing independently zipping coats and putting on winter clothing.
